














I hope the year is going along nicely for you all.

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

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C8 Corvette ZR1 Sets Five U.S. Racetrack Lap Records

When the C8 Corvette ZR1 made its world debut back in July 2024, it stunned the sports car world by cradling the most powerful V8 engine ever produced in America from an automaker. And thanks to the added handling prowess of its available ZTK Performance Package, the Corvette ZR1 is now breaking racetrack lap time records across the U.S.

According to Chevy, the Corvette ZR1 recently set five new lap records on four different racetracks with various GM drivers behind the wheel of a Torch Red pre-production unit equipped with the optional ZTK Performance Package (RPO ZTK) as well as the ZR1 Carbon Fiber Aero Package (RPO TOM).

- Lead Performance Engineer, Chassis Controls, Bill Wise set a lap record of 1:52.7 on the long course at Watkins Glen in New York.
- Lead Vehicle Dynamics Engineer Brian Wallace set a lap record of 2:08.6 at Road America in Wisconsin.

- Lead Development Engineer Chris Barber set a lap record of 1:22.8 at Road Atlanta in Georgia.
- Global Vehicle Performance Manager Aaron Link set a lap record of 1:47.7 on the Virginia International Raceway Full Course, in addition to a lap record of 2:32.3 on the VIR Grand Course.

These engineers have a combined 65 years of GM Level 6 driving experience, seemingly the top of the automaker's driver certification program. They all achieved Nürburgring Industry Pool certification as well. In short, they know their way around a track.

And yet, Chevy points out that the Corvette ZR1's performance and handling potential is exploitable by various drivers, as each engineer that set lap time records has their own driving style. "Future customers don't need to be professional drivers to extract the ultimate performance of the 1,064-horsepower Corvette ZR1."

While ZR1 buyers don't have to be pro pilots, they probably should have some experience in high-powered sports cars. After all, the C8 Corvette ZR1 is equipped with the twin-turbocharged 5.5L V8 LT7 engine that belts out 1,064 horses and 828 pound-feet of torque, all sent to the rear wheels via the GM eight-speed, dual-clutch transmission. GM claims the ZR1 can blast from 0 to 60 mph in 2.3 seconds, clear the quarter-mile in 9.6 seconds, and reach a top speed of 233 mph.

Pricing for the 2025 Corvette ZR1 starts at \$174,995 including the destination freight charge. Available on both 1LZ and 3LZ trim levels of the coupe and the convertible, the ZTK Performance Package costs \$1,500 and includes the ZTK suspension with Magnetic Selective Ride Control (RPO FEJ) as well as the 275/30ZR20 front and 345/25ZR21 rear Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2 tires. However, the package also requires selecting the \$8,495 ZR1 Carbon Fiber Aero Package that adds the high-wing spoiler, dive planes and the tall hood spoiler, all finished in visible carbon fiber.

The Corvette ZR1 will be built at the GM Bowling Green plant in Kentucky, as is the case with all other C8 Corvette variants. The ZR1 configurator is now live and dealers are set to start submitting orders, while the start of regular production is expected to start in the second quarter of 2025.

Callaway Corvette C7 GT3-R to Return to GT World Challenge America Series in 2025

With a proven 60-year-old driver behind the wheel, the #70 Callaway Corvette C7 GT3-R will be looking to prove that it's still got some gas in the tank, despite not being the shiniest new toy in the garage.

Veteran driver Mirco Schultis will be driving the C7 Corvette for MISHUMOTORS in the 2025 GT World Challenge America powered by AWS series, beginning with the opening round of the season at Sonoma Raceway, California this weekend.

Schultis made the decision to return in the Corvette after SRO America reverted GT America to its original 40-minute, single-driver sprint format for 2025. The series initially planned an option for two drivers and pit stops, but the change was reversed after being met with limited interest from competitors.

"I made the decision to come back in January after SRO went back to the old GT America race format. I'm looking forward especially to Long Beach, where I had the second fastest lap in both races. For sure, it's an old lady that never got an EVO package...but I just love her. It's difficult to fight with the others on some circuits where aero is needed. But I'm looking forward to testing myself against the competition this year," Schultis said.



Callaway Corvette C7 GT3-R to Return to GT America Series in 2025

Besides Sonoma, the GT America series will have seven other rounds of competition, including Grand Prix of Long Beach, Circuit of the Americas, Sebring, VIRginia International Raceway, Road America, Barber Motorsports Park, and Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

The Callaway C7 may be entering its 10th year of competition, but it will have a new yellow, orange, pink, and purple livery in honor of Paulaner Sunset, an all-natural, German-brewed orange cola that is the new primary sponsor of the MISHUMOTORS Callaway Corvette.

The Callaway C7 GT3-R debuted in 2016 and enjoyed its most successful season the next year as Callaway Competition took the ADAC GT Masters Teams' and Drivers' Championships. It's also won races in GT World Challenge Asia and the SRO Japan Cup series.

In 2022, MISHUMOTORS began competing in GT America with the Callaway GT3-R chassis #001, which had been originally used by the Callaway Competition team. Since then, Schultis and the Callaway Corvette have compiled eight SRO3 class podiums in 40 races, with a best finish of second at Indianapolis Motor Speedway in 2022.

Alroy House is located on Rooty Hill Road, Plumpton, N.S.W. It is a single storey home, built in the mid-Victorian period. The most distinctive feature of the house is its interesting and complex roof structure.

In 1887, Walter Lamb established the first fruit cannery in this area, which he originally called Woodstock. He set up many orchards on nearby land, to provide fruit for the cannery. Thomas Bowring, who also designed and built the cannery, probably built Alroy House between 1886 and 1888. It was occupied by Edward Lamb, brother of Walter Lamb, and formally transferred into Edward's name in 1891. Edward named the house after a property, Alroy Downs in the Northern Territory, which he had taken up a lease on.

In 1894, Alroy House was transferred to Thomas Cable. After Cable's death, several different people owned the house before being purchased in 1916 by Julius White who was a farmer. During his ownership of Alroy, White appears to have added more modern bathrooms. Although much of the land around the house had been subdivided and sold as smaller farms in earlier years, approximately 6 acres (4,000m2) of land at the rear of the house was included in the property and used for fruit growing. James Wilson purchased the house and land in 1921. It remained with members of the Wilson family until 1981 when it was held by the Public Trustee, before being purchased by the Blacktown City Council in 1985. During the time that it was vacant, Alroy suffered fire damage and the marble fireplaces were stolen from inside.

In 1989, Blacktown City Council approved plans for the restoration of Alroy, which was estimated at \$400,000. At the time, however, the funding for this proposal seemed uncertain. In 1996, Blacktown City Council reportedly spent \$200,000 to restore the exterior and were planning to spend a further \$200,000 the following year on restoration of the interior. In 2006 the interior and grounds were restored and the property reopened as Alroy Tayern.

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
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1963 Corvette Coupe Grand Sport - Tribute

General Motors only produced five original Corvette Grand Sports under the guidance of Zora Arkus-Duntov (the father of performance Corvettes) to compete against and beat the Ford Cobras built by Carroll Shelby for Ford. Zora and his team of engineers were able to beat the Cobras at Watkins Glen in August of 1963, a great victory for General motors and the Corvette Grand Sport.

The Grand Sport formula complimented the 1963 Z06 Special Performance Package for racing teams by getting a bigger engine, 377ci/485hp with quad Webers (up from 327ci/360hp), Muncie 4 speed, Halibrand Magnesium Alloy wheels 15x11" & 15x9.5", a 2" shorter body that was made of light weight fibreglass with flared guards, numerous ventilation vents to reduce overheating that was almost 1/3 of the weight of the standard C2 body that weighed only 1900lbs/860kg. This work of art was bolted to 4" tubular frame with tubular suspension with disc brakes, making the Grand Sport a true competitor to the Cobras.

Sadly, General Motors decided to pull out from racing soon after this to the disappointment of Zora Arkos-Duntov. The five Grand Sports built were placed with private teams and continued competing in racing and eventually the cars ended up with astute collectors. Today, these cars all still in existence and worth an estimated \$10 Million each in the collector car market world.

This Tribute Grand Sport is very rare in Australia and draws a crowd whenever it sees daylight which isn't often as it hasn't quite travelled a 1,000 miles yet. This car started life as a 1966 Corvette Coupe and was transformed into a Grand Sport in 2015 with a no expense attitude to the 3.5 year build of this 1963 Corvette Grand Sport.

The heart had to resemble the original with a 377ci (6.2ltr LS3-Gen IV alloy small block Chevrolet rated at 525hp/392kW & 489ft-lb/663Nm. This modern day equivalent is mated to a Tre-Mec TKO 5spd manual gearbox which drives Forgeline Grudge 3 piece 20x12" & 19x10" alloys with sticky Michelin Pilot Sport Cup Tyres which are driven via a USA Hammerhead Differential with an Eaton 3.42:1 gear ratio. Suspension is from a C7 Corvette as with the brakes which are C7 Z06.

A combination of Grand Sport components were used from Mongoose Motorsports, MID America and Corvette Central to transform the '66 into this '63 modern day Grand Sport that has C7 seats and the all important numbers are viewed through the traditional Grand sport instrumentation, including a 200mph speedometer with custom interior trim to compliment the Route 66 theme.

To further compliment the car as per the originals, side pipes are in play for the gases to escape and provide the rumble and roar of a Grand Sport, what else!

This Corvette Grand Sport Tribute has been fully engineered to 2016/2017 ADR regulations and has full NSW registration from 10/2017. This car has never been raced as owned by a respected and extremely passionate enthusiast to the Corvette world. The car has won many awards including NCRS Australia "427 Concours Award".

It is time to allow another enthusiast or collector to enjoy this Grand Sport. This is a serious toy, which commands serious offers only.
